#### Dear Friends

Happy New Year and welcome to 2025. A New Year, A Renewed Spirit As the clock strikes midnight on New Year's Day, the world collectively turns the page to a new chapter. For many, the new year brings a sense of hope, fresh beginnings, and an opportunity to set new goals. Every year, my resolutions are generally the same; eat more healthily, do more exercise, spend less time looking at social media and more time enjoying the world around me. Writing this January Foreword has allowed me to re-think my resolutions and my path forward, following in the footsteps of Jesus. This year, I plan to make time to sit quietly with God, sharing my thoughts and listening for his voice. I plan to engage more with the scriptures to guide me along the right path in life - most of all I plan to try and find the time to do these things. Often life is so busy, but, as we journey into January, let us keep our eyes fixed on Christ. While we may set goals or hope for specific outcomes, we are reminded in Proverbs 16:9, 'In their hearts humans plan their course, but the Lord establishes their steps.' God's plans for us are always greater than our own and trusting Him to lead us is the best resolution we can make.

As the New Year dawns, I would like to take this opportunity to say thank you to all who took part or attended our wonderful Carols Services, Carols in the church [should have been in the Churchyard], our Midnight Services and Christmas Day Services – a God-filled journey! Likewise, a grateful thanks for your generous donations to the various charities we support. I'm praying that you've had a wonderful Christmas day surrounded by family, friends, and the supernatural joy that comes from reflecting on the birth of Christ.

Christmas doesn't finish on 25th December we continue to celebrate on the feast of the Epiphany and indeed right through to Candlemas on 2nd February. Epiphany, 6th January, is the great celebration of the arrival of the wise men as they come to worship Jesus. At Tewkesbury Abbey there is always a fabulous Epiphany Service [5th Jan] when gifts of Gold, Frankincense and Myrrh are placed at the crib as signs of our offering of ourselves, and being open for spiritual renewal

As I continue to reflect, the truth of Christmas and the truth of Easter are one and the same. Love conquers, love wins. Love is at the heart of reality. The light of Jesus the Christ shines from the manger, from the Cross, and from the Empty Tomb; this transcendent light shines in the deepest darkness of our world, and the darkness cannot overcome it.

We do not know what a New Year will bring but we do know that Jesus will go with us, walk with us and help us, when we invite him in.
