<u>DUMBLETON</u> NEW HEATING SYSTEM IN ST PETER'S

We are converting the heating system in the church to one based solely on green electricity as part of the Church of England's project to become carbon neutral by 2030. The urgency to do this has arisen because of the major failure of our oil storage tank and the age of the oil boiler.

We are hoping that work on the replacement system will start in the near future, but we are still short of funds. An appeal letter is being distributed around the village asking if anybody can kindly contribute to this project. Any help is greatly appreciated.

We have almost used up the remaining oil in the tank and so are unable to heat the church as well as we would wish. When you come to church, please be aware that you will have to wrap up warm!
